II ABOUT HUMANITY

III ABOUT ETERNITY

Humans were created to exist forever to either exist eternally separated from God by sin, or in union with God through forgiveness and salvation. To be eternally separated from God is Hell. To be eternally in union with Him is to live eternally in Heaven. Heaven and Hell are places of eternal existence.
